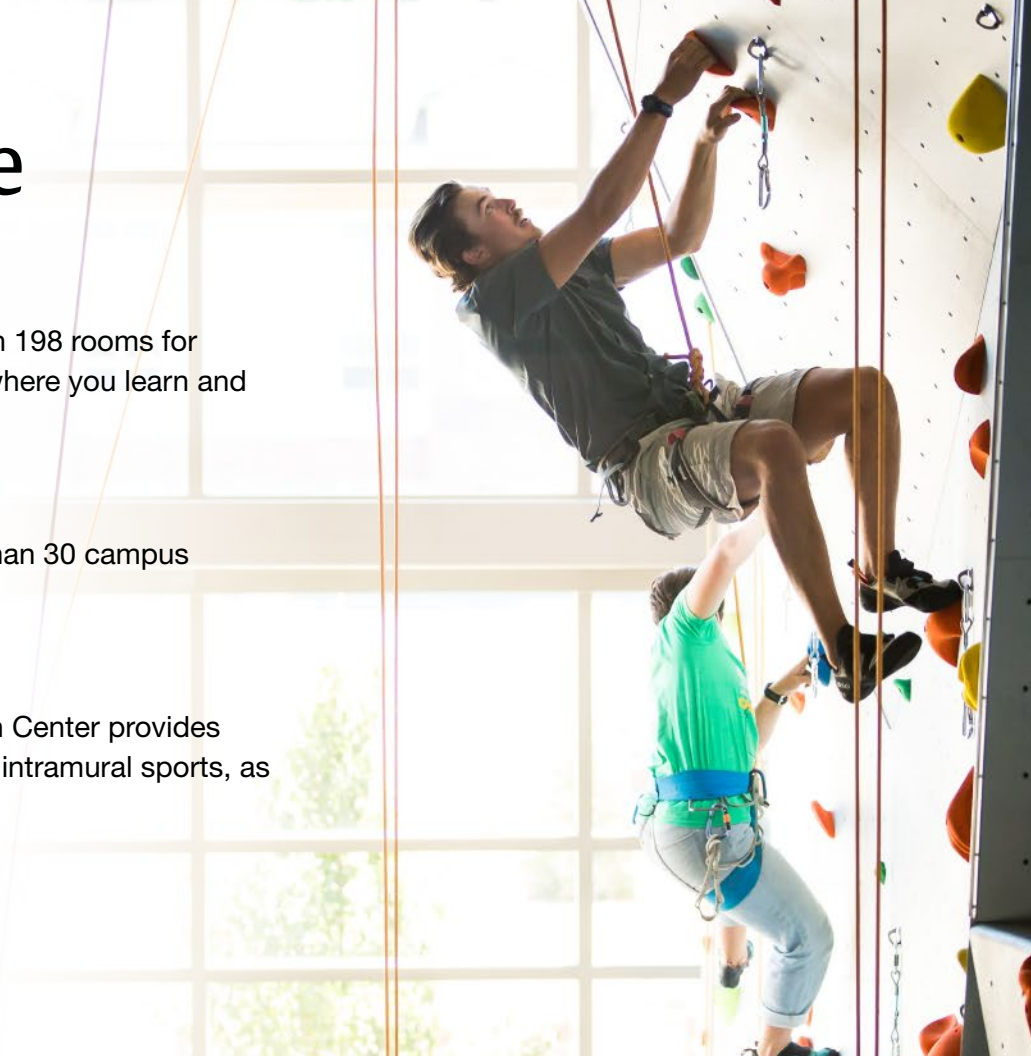
We offer a modern residence hall with 198 rooms for students on our main campus. Live where you learn and be right in the center of student life.

The Student Wellness and Recreation Center provides group fitness classes, recreation and intramural sports, as well as an indoor climbing wall.

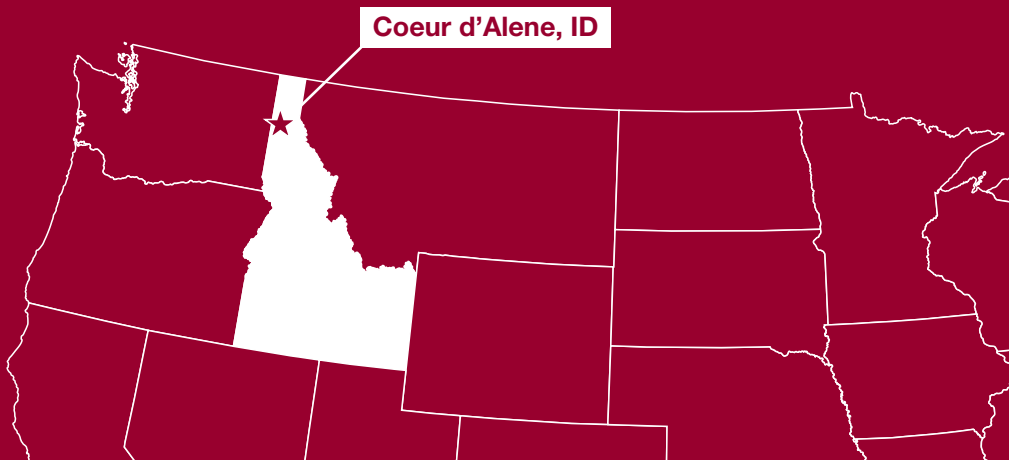




Explore the Area
